PATIENT ELIGIBILITY




Loudoun Free Clinic serves adult Loudoun County residents who are uninsured and earn at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Level. We are also a member-only clinic, so people need to go through an eligibility process to become patients, and have to renew membership on a regular basis by providing tax returns and other documents.


