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Loudoun Free Clinic provides compassionate primary and specialty healthcare to low-income, uninsured adults living in Loudoun County. Our comprehensive services include primary care diagnostic testing, prescription medications, and referrals to trusted specialists all at no cost to our patients. We exist to care for those who might otherwise fall through the cracks of the healthcare system and ensure cost is never a barrier to essential care.

As a member-only clinic, patients must meet financial eligibility requirements and complete pre-registration before receiving services. Membership is renewed annually for patients who continue to meet need-based criteria.

Our work is made possible through the dedication of our staff, community partners, volunteers, and generous donors. Together, we help our neighbors live healthier and more stable lives.

OUR PATIENTS







MEET A PATIENT



Marlene first came to Loudoun Free Clinic while experiencing recurring groin pain. Prior to finding our clinic, Marlene had visited other healthcare facilities where her needs were not fully addressed. While working a full-time job, she became increasingly alarmed by high medical expenses and limited care options.

Marlene eventually learned about Loudoun Free Clinic by word of mouth from another patient. Initially, the thought of starting over at yet another clinic and repeating the same tests and paperwork discouraged her from enrolling. Eventually, with encouragement and support from Maria, LFC's Eligibility and Volunteer Coordinator, she decided to sign up.

Marlene expresses deep gratitude for the care she received during her first appointment with Nurse Practitioner (NP) Pam Sabella. "Everyone was very welcoming. I received medical attention that I had never received before, including medical exams I had never had done," she shares. Due to her ongoing groin pain, NP Sabella referred Marlene for additional testing. Unfortunately, those tests led to a diagnosis of neuroendocrine carcinoma cancer.

Receiving the diagnosis was overwhelming. "When I heard the word 'cancer,' a lot of different thoughts came to mind. 'I'm going to die.' 'What about my family, my kids?'" Marlene said through tears. "It was a very difficult moment for me, and it was hard to process everything on my own. But NP Sabella told me that I wasn't alone and that she was going to help me face this illness. I will always be grateful for that."

Since her diagnosis, Marlene shares that the journey has been extremely challenging, both emotionally and financially, due to missing work for medical treatments and illness. She has faced anxiety, depression, and significant financial strain. However, with the continued support of the clinic's staff and free medical care, she has been able to manage her condition and move forward with strength. "I will always be thankful for everything this clinic has done for me. It has pretty much saved my life," she says. "Everyone always checks in on me to see how I'm doing. I'm especially thankful to Maria for encouraging me to apply, because my plan was never to come here, and to NP Sabella for helping me overcome this disease."

Today, Marlene continues her treatment and recovery journey. With the guidance of our medical and administrative staff, as well as specialist partners, she has adjusted to a new lifestyle that allows her to manage her health with confidence and hope. Marlene's positive experience has inspired her to recommend Loudoun Free Clinic to friends and family and to emphasize the importance of preventive healthcare and early detection.

"LFC is my safe place. I feel comfortable and secure coming in for appointments with NP Sabella and NP Carter," Marlene shares. "I don't have enough words to describe how thankful I am."

Born in Mexico City and shaped by a life of global service, Carmen Rohrbach has always believed in the power of volunteering. She earned a Bachelor's Degree in social science from Ohio University and, alongside her husband, David, spent three decades living in southern Africa. During their time in Zimbabwe, Malawi, and Tanzania, Carmen raised a family and dedicated herself to volunteer work, teaching children, including those with physical disabilities. Reflecting on those years, she shares, "I found volunteering to be incredibly rewarding."



After returning to the United States in 2014, Carmen sought a way to continue giving back and soon found Loudoun Free Clinic (LFC). She joined the clinic as a medical interpreter, drawn to its mission of providing free healthcare to individuals who would otherwise have limited or no access to medical services.

One of her most impactful experiences came during the COVID-19 pandemic, when she helped lead outreach efforts by calling patients to assess how they could be supported remotely. Speaking directly with patients during such an uncertain time was both challenging and inspiring. "The overwhelming gratitude patients expressed, for the clinic and for the staff, was incredibly moving," she says. While the work can be demanding, that gratitude continues to motivate Carmen and her fellow volunteers.

Carmen's commitment to community service was deeply influenced by her years in Africa, where caring for one another was a way of life. "We all have something to contribute to the well-being of our friends, neighbors, and fellow human beings," she says. Carmen believes volunteering is, at its core, an act of sharing and caring. She encourages others to give their time in whatever way they can, emphasizing that every person has talents, expertise, or life experiences that can positively impact someone else's life.

Today, with more than 1,000 hours volunteered with Loudoun Free Clinic, Carmen remains proud to be part of our team. She approaches her work with care, warmth, and dedication. Through her years at LFC, she has learned patience, perseverance, and the importance of kindness. Carmen credits the patients she serves. "They've taught me how to be firm with a smile," she says, "and how to keep going."

Loudoun Free Clinic is deeply grateful for the compassion, dedication, and global perspective Carmen brings to our community. Her years of service continue to make a meaningful difference to the lives of our patients and their families.




